From the Leadership Team

I wonder if anyone back in the book of Acts imagined that a part of life in the body of Christ might someday include annual reports? I don't know. But in a way our annual reports are a latter day continuation of what was put in motion in the early church. In Acts 6:1-3 we see how the early leaders of the church created a form of administration. It wasn't the first time. There are plenty of earlier references to reporting and accountability in the Old Testament too. And so it is that administration and keeping track, and letting what has done be known, turns out to be something the people of the Lord do. Cool!

What is there to report since this time last year? In the spring of 2011 we had come through a difficult year. But encouraged by a growing sense of life at Coast Hills, we were setting a course forward. That year ended with a series of significant events. Having helped us through 2010 and looking forward to his wedding to Marites, our Youth Pastor, Tyson Kliem, advised that he would be accepting an offer to join a sister congregation in Abbottsford. With our blessing, we sent them off to start a new life together. During the same months, with giving lagging behind budget, we were all asked to contribute to a special offering that would "double-the-month" in May.

Announcements were made. A matching contribution was being offered by some in our community and so we were looking forward to the Annual General Meeting toward the end of May. At the same time, on Leadership Team we were undergoing more changes with experienced team members. Don Schmidt stepped down in the new year and Harold Ekkert's second term was coming to a conclusion with the fiscal year. And so we came to the Annual General Meeting with many unknowns, trusting the Lord and looking to see what was next.

In faithfulness, we passed the budget. And the offering was an extraordinary affirmation. As a community, we came together and the special offering raised \$67,771.58. Within a few short days after the AGM, our pastoral search committee learned of the possibility of attracting both Peter Nikkel and Kevin Snyder to join our ministry staff in half-time roles. Peter was able to join us in July; Kevin in November. As you will all have observed, both of these experienced men have brought new energy and direction to Coast Hills and we look forward to working together in the years ahead.

After Harold's term on LT came to a close at the end of May, he led the men in a very successful men's retreat over Father's day weekend in June. In July, more volunteers came together under the leadership of Susanne and our summer intern, Samm Marsh, to run another Coast Hills Kidz Camp. We were able to help another local church with their camp, and Nadine Bugden who led the camp music, travelled to assist our friends, Mike and Kimberly Bogelund, with a kids camp at the church Mike pastors in Alberta. And so the life of Coast Hills returned to familiar rhythms.

We continued a recent tradition - our summer socials. With Kick-Off last fall, Susanne and her volunteers introduced a new curriculum to our Kidz Life programming, and each child was given a Bible. Our Sunday set-up and take-down crews have grown in ability and speed! Heather Hamm and others have provided colourful props for Sunday services. Our Connections team continues to make us welcome. Alpha and Freedom Session programs were offered, along with a number of Life Groups. A men's group with hockey Thursday nights was re-started. Our young adults have formed a group and meet together every couple of weeks. Once a month we have held the CORE meeting which has been a great time to be together, hear what is happening, pray and support one another. The worship ministry team has continued to lead us in joyful praise, and has grown with new talented volunteers.

From the Leadership Team (continued)

Our sound and audio visual teams have continued to serve, and with some newer equipment and computer help, are better able to serve in these roles than ever before. And so it goes.

More recently, Christmas services were a highlight with special decorations reminiscent of another time. At this, and our recent Good Friday celebrations, we welcomed our community more directly. Shortly, a women's retreat will take place at the end of April. It will be followed by another AGM, another men's retreat and, this summer, another Kidz Camp. And so we will continue through the seasons of the year 2012-2013.

These last 12 months have been good and I thank the Lord for the ways He has blessed Coast Hills. The LT believes we are generally on the right track and will be presenting a budget for the coming year that continues us on the path we started out on last year. That budget is a faith budget - it requires a level of giving next year that we managed through regular giving and the special offering last year. We are not consistently giving at this level. But we believe that this is the right course and do not want to have to make any cuts or back off.

As a body, the people of Coast Hills so far have given \$188,543 on a weekly basis this year, with an average under \$19,000 per month. In addition, an additional approximately \$42,000 from the special offering was available as part of our 2011/12 finances (the remainder of the special offering was used to meet budget in 2010/2011 fiscal year). Those figures combined amount to a monthly average of about \$23,000 per month, which so far amounts to \$230,000 to the end of March. At our current rate of giving, the total for the year will be near \$260,000.

On this basis we view the proposed budget as a stretch, but within reach for 2012/2013.

Family & Care Ministries

I begin with the words of the Prophet Isaiah: "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" (Isaiah 52:7)



I am happy to report that I have experienced the joy that is reflected in these words as I have carried out my ministry duties here at Coast Hills. Ten months into my assignment I still have the feeling of *"I'm just getting started"* in my various ministry roles, but at the same time I have a deep sense of fulfillment and well-being. Here are some thoughts about the key areas of contribution that have occupied the 20 hours per week for which I am accountable.

Staff team

It has been a great privilege to work as a team member with Wayne as leader. The involvement at the staff table as we pray, plan, and evaluate allows me to use and apply some of the lessons learned in previous ministry. We have enjoyed a wonderful sense of unity, synergy, and mutual encouragement. It has been very gratifying to be in an environment where we all have an attitude of being lifelong learners.

Family & Care Ministries (continued)

All of us in this privileged leadership circle believe in leading by example and we all realize that it is a profound privilege to be "set apart" for ministry.

Outreach and Connection

I have helped produce the community outreach materials and coordinated their distribution. It is also my commitment, together with all other staff members, to be attentive to newcomers to our services providing them with a warm welcome and giving them opportunity to receive information that relates to their needs. Along with Wayne, we provide follow-up calls to all those who register their names on a connection card. We continue to pray about new ways of connecting with our neighbors and inviting them to make a personal faith commitment. The community response to our Good Friday Easter Egg Hunt shows that Coast Hills has developed a very positive image in this community and we are prayerfully seeking new ways of stewarding this good will.

Preaching and Stewardship

The preaching duties have re-awakened within me the joy of communicating God's truth with the goal of seeing lives changed. While it is impossible to quantify the effect of any sermon, we are encouraged by the receptivity that radiates from the congregants at Coast Hills. In my ten months here it has been my privilege to deliver the Sunday morning message on ten occasions. While I resist being identified as the "money talk guy" I see the need to nurture this area of discipleship. Our Church can be a healthy Church only if we have healthy finances. This will always be a process and we invite you to share your ideas of how we can move forward in this vital aspect of Christian involvement and growth.

Family Ministry and Care

In my role as Pastor of Family Ministries and Care I have sought to be available as a resource for individuals and in group events. The fall Parenting Series on "Birth Order" with Dan Cram got us started, and in the new year Diane and I have coordinated monthly Family Forum evenings at the Ministry Centre. Attendance has been underwhelming so we keep searching for effective ways of supporting parents in their challenging task. In my caring function I am currently conducting a minitelethon – calling everyone listed in our directory and having a 'get acquainted' conversation and a few words of affirmation and encouragement. So far this is well received. An important avenue of care and discipleship comes through our LIFE groups. I have worked in partnership with Wayne in nurturing our existing groups with the commitment of multiplying them so that more people will receive the benefits that come from them.

Blessed

Diane and I have always viewed our ministry as a shared ministry. We have felt God's blessing in the past and are grateful to experience it here at Coast Hills. I am grateful for the compensation that I receive based on a .375 basis, and Diane is happy to make her contribution as a volunteer. My regular weekly schedule is to work Wednesday, Thursday, and half-day Friday for nine months of the year, taking a month off in the fall, winter, & spring. If this sounds too generous, my response is to agree with you as I feel profoundly grateful for the flexibility that is afforded to me.

I have recently had a recurring vision of seeing Coast Hills Church as a dispenser of blessing to everyone that connects with us. My wife Diane, and I, also have as our vision to be a blessing to everyone that connects with us. Thank you for welcoming us into your midst!

Youth Ministry



Youth of this generation are looking through the veneer of faith to something real that is worth getting up each day to live and die for. This generation wants to see and experience deep, authentic faith that impacts their world and transforms lives.

The way I envision youth ministry is to lay Micah 6:8 as a foundation - "do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with your God." I will seek to try and structure this report around these three aspects in reverse order.

Walking Humbly—Jesus walked very humbly but had a strong sense of who He was. As adolescent teens are discovering who they are, questions of identity are paramount. Leading teams of adults that are walking humbly with God, and walking humbly with youth, will serve to mentor this generation to have a strong sense of identity as they live out their faith in a hostile world.

During the Junior High Story Time twice a month, the grade 6—8 students were able to hear compelling stories of faith by real live Coast Hills adults. *Story Time* has been a great place for these youth to see and hear from people who are walking with God. Our focus will shift to *"God's Story and Our Place in It"* for the months ahead.

We are developing a great team of adult youth leaders that are walking humbly with God, and walking humbly with youth that will serve to mentor this generation to have a strong sense of identity as they live out their faith in a hostile world. I am very impressed with the leaders we have both on *Tuesday nights,* as well as Sunday mornings who are committed to walking with our youth.

Loving Mercy—To love mercy in youth ministry is to provide leaders and students with the opportunity to experience the generous mercy of God for themselves and then lead them to courageously give that same love to all others whom they meet. Often this is experienced through a loving, authentic community that is "sharing life" with one other. In community, whether in small groups, short-term mission assignments, or ministry teams, retreats and families, we experience the generous mercy of God through relationship. We have had the opportunity to experience this during both the *Surge* (grade 9-12) and *Shine* (grade 6-8) *Retreats* this spring for longer extended times.

Doing Justly—We need to lead youth to places of injustice, where people have been robbed of what could have been so that we are able to "do justly." Youth should not be "kept from" these places but rather led to them to help reveal the kingdom of God. I would love to see youth involved in their city and neighbourhoods where they can build Shalom, whether that is serving at a local soup kitchen, sorting clothes at a shelter, picking up garbage at the park, visiting and praying for the sick, or sitting with the kid at school who no one else does.

We will be participating in *SOAR Vancouver, August 3—12th*. We will be teaming up with MB Mission and Church Planting BC to engage in a ten-day discipleship/missions adventure. This opportunity is for Grades 8-12 and is also open to families who would like to join in on the adventure!

We will also be developing a two-day discipleship/missions adventure that will take place right here in Cloverdale. It will be called **42**. We will spend 42 hours *doing justly, loving mercy and walking humbly* with God in our community in the name of Jesus. I am hoping this would not only involve youth, but would be open to the rest of our church to be involved in as well. Keep an eye out for **42** in the weeks and months ahead.

As we lead a generation to *do justly, love mercy and walk humbly*, I believe that we will lead a movement of diverse people into a grace-filled covenant relationship with the living God that will transform individual lives and whole communities who will discover and follow Jesus!

We had the opportunity this year to change to a new curriculum. We have chosen "*Hands-on Bible Curriculum*".

It uses unique games, snacks and crafts to help kids learn about God, because kids retain more about a lesson by interacting with it rather than just hearing it. If you walk down the hall on a Sunday morning...you will see this in action. Preschoolers singing great songs, acting like sheep as they learn about their "Good Shepherd". Others opening their Bibles and highlighting the verses they are learning about, science experiments, acting, drama, art, finding glow in the dark crosses...the list goes on and on.

What is most important to me is a few things right now...

- ⇒ When children leave Kidz Life that they know how to navigate through their Bible and where to find truths and support when they need it. When they enter high school and later leave our homes, the truths that they have learned during these formative years become a powerful back drop for the many decisions that they will need to make.
- ⇒ That they have been mentored and discipled in a fun, safe and caring environment with great teachers in class room settings.
- \Rightarrow That they experience and learn something new in Kidz Life each Sunday.
- ⇒ Parents feel supported as they raise their children to follow God. That if parents choose, they can use the take home sheets and continue with the momentum of learning at home.
- ⇒ Providing opportunities for parents to volunteer in Kidz Life and become part of the spiritual learning that is happening.
- \Rightarrow That the children make great friends and enjoy seeing each other weekly.

We were able to hand out a Bible to each child in preschool to grade five. That was a highlight for me!

Missions

As part of missions, through our Community Care Fund we are able to help people in need in our church, as well as in our local community. Our mission at Coast Hills is to be a serving and sending church to places beyond the neighborhoods we live in.

Many different places get touched directly or indirectly through Coast Hills people, but I would like to touch on four areas that are in a yearly cycle:

- 1. *MB church planting throughout Canada.* Our heart has always been to see more churches get launched throughout our Province and Canada, so a portion of our church budget is designated to our denomination. I serve on two church plant boards Real Life in Fleetwood and Emmaus in South Surrey.
- Dalit Freedom in India. A few years back we heard from the director of this organization which ministers to the "untouchables" - the lowest caste in India. Some of you support children monthly through this network. A women's night hosted by Chantal Hilton was held last month to support this ministry.
- 3. *Mexico Orphanage in the City of Colima.* A few years ago a group went for a ten-day missions trip, and another is planned for this November 9th—18th. These trips are life changing for those who participate and a chance to care for children and the staff in this incredible ministry.
- 4. Zimbabwe "Hear Africa Foundation". This year we were able to support ten orphan children through a Christmas fundraiser. Sophirina, a wonderful, compassionate and Godly woman in the city of Mutare had taken these destitute children in and was in need of grocery and school money. We were able to help through the generosity of Coast Hills donors. What a highlight it was for me to go to Zimbabwe in February and meet Sophirina! I was also able to preach at a church in Kendaya whom Coast Hills had helped during the economic collapse in 2008. The people literally had no corn seed to plant their fields that year, so we sent money to Hear Africa and now four years later I was able to visit that church and they proudly walked me to a healthy field of corn that they called the "Coast Hills Field". I wish you could all have seen the way they smiled, gave speeches of thanks, sang and danced to express appreciation to our church.

We are committed to living out our mission throughout the world and look forward to the ways God directs us in this next year.

Howdy Coast Hills!

Well, it's hard to believe that it's been almost four years since you pushed us out of the nest to plant Real Life Community Church in Fleetwood! It has been an eventful couple years, so it's no wonder that the time has passed so quickly.

This last year has been a very dynamic year for us as a church, but we have definitely seen God's hand throughout it. Last February, I (Mike) was diagnosed with cancer, which meant sudden change and upheaval for both our family and our church. I was unable to work for three months, which meant that most of my responsibilities fell onto volunteers within our congregation. It all happened so suddenly and yet, with God in control, it went relatively smoothly. Our Task Force Leadership Team gave stability to the congregation during that season, and many volunteers took over key pastoral roles. It was amazing to see how well our little church pitched in to keep things rolling along. God provided Lee Francois (now of Crossridge Church) to cover a lot of the preaching during my absence. A year later, my health is good, the doctors are saying I'm cancer free, and Real Life Community Church is still trucking along. It was not a pleasant experience by any stretch, but it was a very good experience. It taught us to REALLY trust that God is in control of everything. It showed us how strong the body of Christ is, and how resilient she is. It reminded me that the church is not built on me, but on the rock of Jesus Christ.

As we look to the coming year, we are expectant of what God can do. We are bursting at the seams with kids, and continually adapting to the wonderful challenges that this brings. Our Sunday attendance has been growing "*slowly but steadily*" and we are often 100+ on a Sunday morning. Best of all, we are seeing the long term impact that this church is having in this neighbourhood. We're seeing "regular visitors" from the community, who show up for every kids camp, Easter egg hunt, and Christmas service. We're continuing our involvement with the Fleetwood Community Association, as well as the elementary school which we meet in. And as we deepen our relationships with neighbours around us, many of them are starting to ask about God, church, and faith.

We appreciate your continuing prayers and partnership. As we "grow up," we appreciate more and more what Coast Hills has invested in us. You gave us not only people and dollars, but so much more. You gave us a healthy sense of optimism. You gave us a great model to follow. We were recently visited by another local pastor, as we were preparing for our Easter Egg Hunt. He was baffled at the audacity of a small church reaching into its community in such a big way. He basically said *"I would have never thought that this would be possible!"* Our volunteers didn't even blink; to them it's normal...and it's normal because you modelled it to us as being normal. Thank you!
